A Promotion Ceremony Fit For A General

The road to becoming a General in the military is often decades long and faced with fierce competition along the way. Few people have the drive and determination to last the long road to eventually be selected for the rank of General. That selection doesn't even guarantee becoming a General, because it is subject to nomination by the President and then confirmation by the Senate. Whitefish Bay is lucky enough to be home to one of the Air Force's newest Generals, Brigadier General Paul E. Knapp, who was promoted this past March.

Originally from the small town of Antigo, Wisconsin, Paul has always been motivated to serve our country. He graduated from the U.S. Air Force Academy in 1992 with a degree in political science and a minor

in Japanese. After numerous deployments and countless hours spent as a student in the Flying Training Squadron, Paul became a master navigator and has over 3,000 flight hours logged, including over 300 in combat.

While his brother, Eric, also serves as a Colonel in the Air Force, he played an even larger role in Paul's life by setting him up on a successful blind date. Eric is married to Renee's cousin and the pair was convinced that Paul and Renee would make the perfect match, but getting them to meet was the tricky part.

Renee who grew up in Appleton, Wisconsin was in the middle of her medical residency in Toledo, Ohio. Time off was extremely rare during residency, so after much joking back and forth, Renee only agreed to meet Paul if he came to Ohio. "This was before social media or instant photos from a phone. So when



we were exchanging pictures I purposefully sent her all of my 'hero shots' - in front of an F-15 in my military gear, skiing in the Swiss Alps, and catching large fish in Alaska," said Paul while laughing. "Her response was to not send me any pictures, which of course

now is comical, but at the time was a little worrisome. My brother had told me that she's a Miller Lite in a bottle type of girl not flowers, so I showed up to her clinic with a 6-pack of beer and hoped for the best."

The set up was a success and they were engaged six months later. When Renee was deciding where to become a family practice doctor, she was drawn to Milwaukee for two reasons. First, her mother was ill and required help, which Renee was happy to offer. The second being that Renee went to undergrad at UW-Milwaukee and loved the vibe of the city. "I basically told Paul that if he wanted to stay with me, our life together would have to be in Milwaukee," said Renee. "He willingly went from active duty to the reserves, and his career took a backseat so that I could follow my own career dreams while also being near my mother. That decision has always weighed on me until now, when he was able to fulfill his dream of becom-

ing a General. To me, this promotion to General shows what dedication Paul has to the military because he was able get promoted even after leaving active duty." It should be noted that Paul sweetly said after her comment, "I've made some poor decisions in my life, but this was not one of them - being with Renee was worth it all."

In 2005 the couple welcomed the title of parents, with the arrival of their first child, Connor. Two years later Connor was joined by his sister, Kennedy, who goes by KiKi. Even with Paul often gone for military assignments, the family remains extremely close. Connor plays baseball and is also a competitive shooter, even earning first place in state-wide competitions. KiKi is a happy-go-lucky child and loves anything involving music. She sang the National Anthem at Paul's promotion ceremony and did such a fantastic job it brought many audience members to tears.

While at the promotion ceremony, one of the talking points was what are some of Paul's proudest moments in the military. "Without a doubt my proudest moments are the bombs we didn't drop in combat," said Paul. "The times when we were well within the rules of engagement but because we didn't know within our heart of hearts that it would only target the 'bad guys' and that innocent people wouldn't also be collateral damage, we didn't drop.

One thing that makes our military different from other countries militaries is that we go to extreme lengths, many times even putting ourselves at more risk, to make sure that the people we are fighting with have no civilian casualties and limit if not eliminate civilian impact."

His new role as General comes with an extreme set of responsibilities. Paul is now an Airborne Emergency Action Officer,

meaning that while on alert, he would be airborne within just minutes with a crew able to serve the President.

The Knapp family loves life in Whitefish Bay and can't wait to celebrate the 4th of July with the newly appointed General, who to them is just their lovable husband and father.

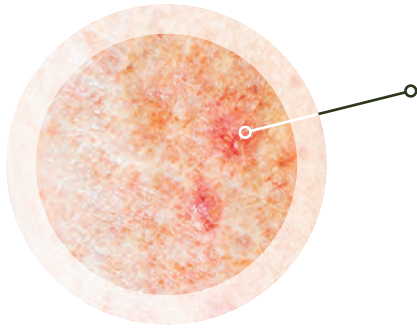

Skin Cancer Awareness

Summer sun should bring skin cancer awareness. Skin cancer is the most common type of cancer in the United States, but it is also one of the most preventable. Between 85 and 90% of skin cancers are associated with exposure to UV radiation from tanning beds and sunlight.

While a summer tan may look healthy, any change in skin color after exposure to UV radiation is a sign of injury to skin cells. Some people, including those with fair skin, blue or green eyes, or those with a family history of skin cancer, are at a higher risk of skin cancer. Reducing exposure to UV rays can significantly lower the chances of developing skin cancer:

- ▶ Use a broad-spectrum sunscreen with a sun protection factor (SPF) of 15 or higher
- ▶ Wear sunglasses, a hat, and clothing that covers your arms and legs
- ▶ Stay in the shade when possible, especially during midday (10am-2pm)
- ▶ Avoid indoor tanning



Although prolonged exposure to the sun can be dangerous, a little bit of sunshine is beneficial. UV radiation induces the body's production of vitamin D, an essential vitamin that helps the body absorb calcium and phosphorus from food and assists bone development. However, according to the World Health Organization (WHO), you get all the Vitamin D your body needs in just 5 to 15 minutes of direct sun exposure (NOT through a window) 2 to 3 times a week.

UPDATED STATUS of the Whitefish Bay Firehouse (Station 84) Remodel Project

Just about a year ago, in May 2018, we wrote about the impending remodel of the firehouse on East Lexington Boulevard, our Station 84. A few short months later, we provided an update, indicating the project was on-hold, due to higher than expected construction costs. Now, we are excited to provide the latest update; the remodel is underway!

Working closely with the Village of Whitefish Bay, and the other six member communities that make up North Shore Fire/Rescue, modifications were made to the construction plan that offered a more economic project; but still met the operational and personnel needs of NSFR. Construction began in early June, as is being completed in phases. The entire project is expected to be completed by late Summer/early Fall.

Personnel will continue to staff the station throughout all phases of construction. The first phase involves the removal of the two garage doors facing North Marlborough Drive. This space will be converted to a temporary living quarters. Once complete, the personnel will move into this space while the kitchen, restrooms and dorm spaces are remodeled. Finally, as crews move back into the newly remodeled spaces, the temporary living quarters will be converted into a workout and training space for the crews. Prior to the remodel, crews utilized the garage floor as their workout space; unnecessarily exposing them to vehicle exhaust.

Besides the removal of the doors on Marlborough Drive, the most outward facing changes in the remodel will be the replacement of the garage doors on East Lexington Boulevard. They will be replaced with large open glass doors, giving the building a more welcoming and transparent look for the community. While the remaining changes will take place inside the building, we are excited that the remodel will offer separate restroom spaces for males and females (current spaces are shared), increased privacy sleeping spaces and locker rooms and other updates including ADA compliance.

On behalf of Chief Robert Whitaker, and all of the personnel from NSFR, thank you for your continued support. Without you, none of this would be possible. 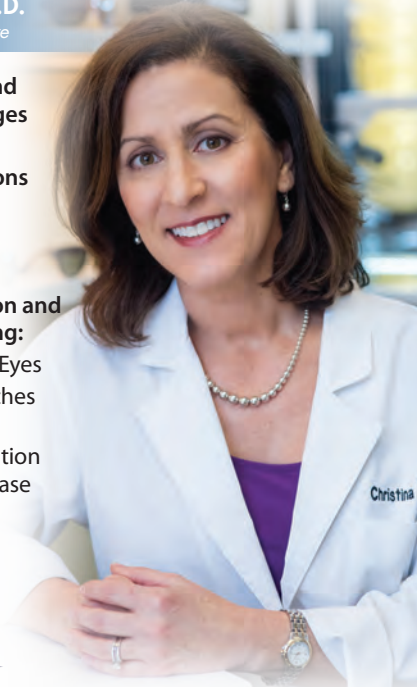

Fireworks *Fear Factor* – PET EDITION



WE ALL KNOW THAT PETS ARE AFRAID OF FIREWORKS, BUT DO YOU KNOW WHY?

- ▶ **Fireworks Are Loud!** Most fireworks make some kind of loud sound. These sounds naturally terrify pets since they have a more acute sense of hearing than humans.
- ▶ **Fireworks Come Without Warning!** Other things that scare pets come with warnings (think thunderstorms or trips to the vet), so naturally, unexpected and repeated loud explosions will cause them to be very frightened.
- ▶ **Fireworks Present a Threat!** Many pets perceive fireworks as a real threat, which triggers their “flight” response. They may even show signs of anxiety and restlessness, like panting, whining and pacing.
- ▶ **The Pet Feels Trapped!** If fireworks have triggered an animal’s flight response but they can’t escape the threat, his fear and anxiety will continue as long as the fireworks continue.
- ▶ **The Pet Feels Vulnerable!** If your pet senses that fireworks are a threat to their safety and doesn’t have an escape route, they will naturally feel vulnerable and may react in unexpected ways like bolting, biting, or accidents in the house.

The best plan for pets is to keep them home and indoors during fireworks. Keep them in a room where they feel safe and provide white noise like a radio or television to drown out the sounds from outside. Before the fireworks start make sure your pet has a collar with current ID tag on them just in case they do escape for a speedy return.

AT THE JOURNAL C-13 STATION

JOE BOOZ (PRONOUNCED "BOSE") was a war veteran who over three decades managed hundreds of newsboys – about 90 at a time – who delivered The Milwaukee Journal to 5,000 subscribers in Whitefish Bay. Joe died in May 2018 at age 96.

Many carriers worked with Joe out of the C-13 station, a sheet-metal shack hidden behind the Clark gas station on Wilson Dr. and Hampton Rd. – you remember, just behind Dairy Queen and the little strip mall with Puccini's Pizza, Kohler Liquor Store, Fireside Restaurant, and Rosen's Pharmacy. The Chicago & Northwestern trains would roar past the station, horns honking and shaking the floor.

The Journal had about 90 stations around Milwaukee County. They were sheet-metal, uninsulated pale-green shacks about the size of a two-car garage. It was heated by a big, old pot-bellied coal stove. It would take awhile to get heated, but when the belly was cherry red we would throw the station's front and rear doors wide open it was so hot in there.

The bike-and-wagon carriers like me went to the station everyday to pick up and "sub" the papers. "Subbing" was the term for stuffing the pre-printed Green Sheet and ads into the main news section. We were expected to hustle and get out promptly on our daily afternoon and early Sunday morning routes. Routes were often a family affair with mom or dad driving on Sundays and brothers and sisters helping at other times.

Joe would be at the station every Saturday morning, collecting carriers' weekly bills. We would line up to pay and the money would pile up in his cash box. He'd call us by the nicknames he'd given us – Chromey, Bobsey Twins, PeeWee, Balloon Head, to name a few. It was a good place to hang out.

Joe really liked us kids. He got mad when we screwed up, but Joe took an interest in us and joked around with us. That made the job fun.

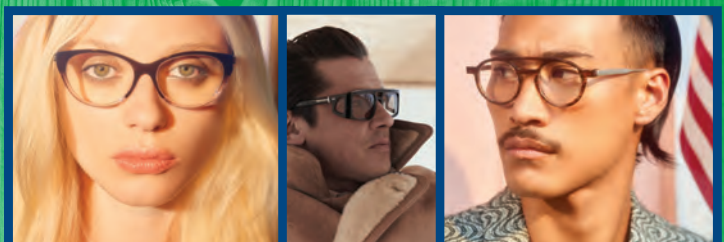

HEALTHY FOOD HACKS

Whether your goal is to drop a few pounds, boost your energy or just eat a little healthier, we all love a good healthy food hack, right? I find making small changes to my favorite foods and recipes is more sustainable than crash dieting. Keep reading for a few of my favorite healthy food hacks.



Rice Bowl Hack

Cauliflower is everywhere these days, making cameo appearances to lighten up everything from gnocchi and pizza crust to “mashed potatoes” and fried rice. The riced, frozen stuff is

so convenient and can be used for many applications. If you're looking for a healthier rice bowl (but don't want to cut out the grain completely), try swapping half the white or brown rice out for cauliflower rice. This way, you get the flavor and chewiness but you slash the carbs in half.



Protein Coffee Hack

Here is one you may have seen circulating on social media. If you love coffee and are watching calories, listen up. Swing by your favorite coffee shop and order two shots of espresso over ice in a large cup. Pour in your favorite protein shake (I like Premier Protein in the caramel flavor). It's as easy as that. It tastes like an iced caramel latte and won't break the calorie—or actual—bank. This can be done at home if you own an espresso machine. I have a milk frother, and I can tell you this works well hot, too. The protein shake becomes creamy and frothy. You won't believe it's healthier for you.



Chips & Guac Hack

An avocado contains about 30 grams of fat. While this is mostly healthy fat, it is still a considerable amount, especially when it's easy to down a whole one in the form of guacamole without batting an eye. Lighten up guacamole by incorporating nonfat

Greek yogurt in a ratio of three parts avocado to one part yogurt. Not only does the yogurt provide a nice tang, it adds volume without any fat. For dippers, consider baked plantain chips, tortilla chips made from beans or slices of crunchy jicama.



Sub Shop Hack

You can still be healthy while eating fast food, and here is proof. Order a 6-inch vegetable sub without cheese on whole wheat bread. Then, go crazy with the vegetables! Finish with some honey mustard or light mayonnaise and there you have it: a healthier fast food option. Bonus: At many sub shops, this sandwich rings in at right around five bucks.



Eggless Egg Salad Hack

Say what now? That's right! You can make eggless (even vegan!) egg salad. This hack is quick, tasty and perfect to whip up for a summertime lunch on the deck. Simply drain and rinse a can of chickpeas and mash them in a bowl with a fork. Add in salt and pepper, a couple tablespoons of vegan mayo, lemon juice, maybe a dab of mustard and a scoop of pickle relish—whatever you typically put in egg salad. Serve it in between two slices of bread or on a bed of lettuce and chow down. This is so good; I find I prefer it to classic egg salad. Bonus: chickpeas have more than twice the protein that eggs do.


